- A. Committee Updates
 - a. LV Curriculum: Eleanor Gomez
 - i. Math Intervention: Hiring a full-time interventionist seems like the best way forward b/c facilitators having a hard time finding time to do intervention.
 - ii. Bridges and Mathmatics (curriculum for intervention)
 - iii. Other ideas: differentiating instruction, time for cross-curricular planning, ways to tie subjects together, standardizing manipulatives worthwhile for facilitators so every class has what they need.
 - iv. Family and community connection: interventionist would connect with families of struggling learners to help encourage support at home.
 - b. UV Curriculum: Heidi Rickard
 - i. Heidi wants to work on curriculum repository b/c she feels it is not as helpful as it needs to be.
 - ii. Need a high school curriculum for ELD to move them through and grow their language skills
 - iii. School Library/ Research space, place to show off learner work, presentation space,
 - iv. Mastery-Based Grading has been the focus: committee is supportive of this move but feels they are **not** in a place to implement M-B G next fall.
 - 1. Need more discussion around this, lots of confusion (
 - a. standards vs. skill sets) also
 - b. challenging with PBL, and
 - c. staff turnover next year
 - d. ACLC feels similarly
 - e. Want more time to research this so we can roll it out well and make it smooth and understandable for facilitators and learners
 - f. NOTE: Jupiter (grading platform) has S-B G.
 - c. School Culture: Eddie Garrett
 - i. Learner Survey Results (MS and HS learners)
 - 1. Learners are feeling a little less supported socially (believes due to lack of clubs and activities b/c of COVID)
 - 2. Learners are not feeling Nea implements PBL "very effectively"
 - 3. Most learners feel challenged by their facilitators

- 4. Improvement in number of learners who would recommend Nea to other learners and families
- 5. Leaerners would like more social activities
